

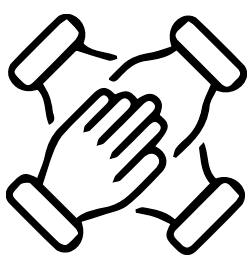


5 ways ELLs succeed with Mirror



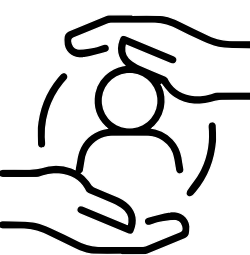
1. Personal reflection in native language:

Allows holistic evaluation of content understanding separate from English proficiency



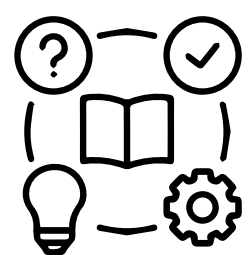
2. Tap into background knowledge:

Connects students' diverse experiences to their learning, especially in literacy



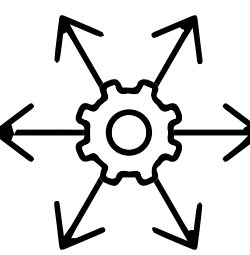
3. Private expression:
